

## FROM COUNCIL CHAIR (Jim Jackson)

## Water in the Boiler Room ... No More!!

Those who attended the Annual Meeting will recall that there was a motion requesting approval to hire DSI Contracting to stop the water problem in the Boiler Room. At this meeting, cooler heads requested that additional quotes be requested to ensure we had the best price and the best results. Subsequently, we found three more companies who expressed an interest and two who did a site visit. The end result was that no other company submitted a proposal for this work. At the April 11 Council meeting, a motion

was carried to approve the \$24,295 bid submitted by DSI Contracting. Once work started, other areas on the West and South walls were discovered to be leaking water into the basement which has added another \$4,000. We also agreed that extra concrete board and four concrete and steel posts should be removed at a cost of \$1,000.

## In total the project cost, including tax, is \$29,945.

The transformation in the basement from April 2, when the job started to April 9 when final clean-up was completed, has been wonderful. In the time the construction took place, the Boiler Room has gone from a wet humid area to a dry and clean area. I think this is a success story. A **caveat:** *this project is a first step in reducing* water in the basement boiler room. There is still water filtration occurring around the footings on the wall adjacent to the back parking area. More to come on this project.

## How will we pay for this Project?

As Chair of the Trinity Council, I am making a direct appeal to everyone that receives this information to donate an amount you feel you can afford. Please remember that we need to raise \$29,945 or \$30,000 in round numbers. The donation could be a lump sum or donations on a monthly basis. Please identify this donation as **"Dry Basement Project".** We have already provided a \$12,000 deposit from our General Account when the work started.
